Annual Report 2008

Title of the project: **The Programme of Rehabilitation of Torture Victims in Georgia**

Aim of the project:

Overall Goal of the activities conducted by the RCT/EMPATHY and Partners are: Development of National Wide System of Comprehensive Medical, Psychological, Social and Legal Rehabilitation of Torture Victims in Georgia; Effective Documentation of cases of torture in accordance with Istanbul Protocol, Implementation of international standards on prevention of torture in Georgia.

The overall objective is focused around following items: (1) to develop national standards for the identification, treatment and rehabilitation (both short and long-term) of victims of torture for use by forensics experts, medical professionals, and others, especially by health care service in Penal System in Georgia and in Military Conflict Zones' professionals too; (2) To set up in the Country practice the international standards for documentation of torture cases and for medical expertise in accordance with "Istanbul Protocol"; (3) to help "civilianize" or "de-militarize" the prison system in Georgia, through regular access into this system by qualified, civilian professionals providing much needed care to victims of torture; set up the standards for investigation and examination of torture outcomes and consequences, for documenting of torture cases and for treatment and rehabilitation of torture and ill – treatment victims, being inside prison institutions, in penal system's health care services in Georgia; (4) to establish trauma recovery and crisis intervention services in Penal System and in Military Conflict zones (Gali), and nearest military conflict zones in Georgia. (5) To promote the ratification of Optional Protocol to the UN Conventional against Torture and its implementation at the Country practice together with other torture prevention activities.

Target Beneficiaries:

Target beneficiaries in year 2008 were direct torture and ill – treatment victims, as well as the prisoners needed in adequate medical services in penal system in Georgia, as well as new victims of torture, ill – treatment and mass war violence and crime, consequently of Russian brutal military attacks to Georgia.

Results achieved in terms of assistance to victims:

- Victims of torture were participated in program activities and received a high level of professional care as well as a feeling of security that they have a safe place to turn for care. According to the Data in year 2008 total number of direct beneficiaries treated and rehabilitated were 708 persons victims of torture, ill – treatment or mass war violence.
- The standardized diagnostic system which is developed in this program for identification, documentation and rehabilitation of torture victims and their family members is successfully developed and operating. Several updated medical files, forms and evaluation procedures were improved and set upped at the RCT/EMPATHY practical work.
- The international standards according to the Istanbul Protocol for medical and psychological expertise of victims of torture are set up and developed in Georgia that EMPATHY and PRI can promote for duplication in other NIS countries. Total number of prepared medical records according to the Istanbul Protocol in year 2008 was about 6 cases. Also should be mentioned that practically all diagnostic investigations and documentation of cases of torture at the RCT/EMPATHY are provided according to IP guidelines.
- This program is provide a model for rehabilitation and treatment of victims of torture that EMPATHY and PRI , also IRCTcan promote for duplication in other NIS countries. The knowledge and experience of this programme was presented by the RCT/EMPATHY representative on the International Training – Seminar on Prevention of Torture held by the UN with support of the IRCT in Uzbekistan in December 2008, this training was held for prison and forensic doctors, as well as for prison staff.
- The program was provide opportunities for positive change on the policy level, including providing capacity to the Ministry of Health to include victims of torture in its program design for the future (through cooperation with this NGO) and helping to build the capacity of the Ministry of Justice and its departments to accurately identify and track victims of torture in its system, as well as to train prison personnel and other officials how to treat victims of torture and all prisoners or detainees, following basic human rights standards. It should be mentioned that in several cases MoJ and MoH were provided co – financing of the urgent cases that were needed inpatient treatment or surgery operations. But it should be mentioned too that the state officials do not recognize officially that the torture and ill treatment exists in Georgia.
- Several important publications and public awareness campaigns, including PR actions and TV advertisements were provided for aware victims of torture that they can applied to the RCT/EMPATHY for qualified assistance.
- Was set up a multi-disciplinary, treatment system for victims of torture the procedure for treatment was automatically improved. The awareness of torture victims and the number of victims tortured still in Georgia were hopefully bring about a will for Government officials to stop this practice through policy change and pressure on the responsible parties to stop. A Public awareness campaign, including information on program activities, some preventative program activities and the wide

advertisement of available services, also made a positive change in improving the general acceptance by the victims themselves (not to be ashamed to seek treatment) of psychological and psychiatric treatment.

- The “Hot line” Service with duty doctor position for immediate reacting and assistance was developed and operated for victims of torture, that is innovation activities and helps not only victims of torture, but presents the important preventive mechanism for prevention of torture in Georgia.
- The Branch offices of the RCT/EMPATHY in Penal system – Women Colony Rehabilitation Centre and Juvenile Colony Rehabilitation Centre - still are operating and the crisis intervention and monitoring programmes in Penal System of Georgia are still running as well, that is the great direct support for existing in this system torture victims and as well as presents the strong preventive mechanism for prevention of torture, ill – treatment and inadequate medical care toward to prisoners.
- It should be mentioned that the Branch Office of the RCT/EMPATHY – Partner in Military Conflict Zone in Abkhazia – Gali Crisis Centre - is successfully operating, that is very important support in created new military conflict situation in this military conflict zone where are great number of new torture and ill – treatment victims.
- The special Crisis intervention Programme was developed and operated during and after the new Military Conflict (Russian intervention) in Georgia, in August 2008, that increased number of torture and ill – treatment victims in year 2008;

Major developments and challenges encountered during the implementation period (organizational matters, events in the country, etc.):

New Developments:

- 1) **Specially should be noted that in August 2008 the Russian Military Forces attacked to Georgia**, consequently the number of Torture and ill treatment victims, victims of war crime and severe violation of international humanitarian law were increased in Georgia. For that reason the special Crisis Intervention Programme in the framework of the ongoing project was developed by the RCT/EMPATHY.
- *As a result of this aggression more than 150000 civilians became victims of ethnic cleansing. Civilians were bombed by Russian air-jets, widely took place marauding, robbery, mass violence, burning of living houses, destroying of villages; Captivity, Torture and Ill treatment*
 - *Cornfields and forests were burnt;*
 - *Wide range of infrastructure was destroyed in Georgia, among them medical facilities;*
 - *Many civilians were wounded and killed, among them journalists and medical personnel.*
 - *It should be specially indicated, that mentioned above actions were continuing after August 12 cease-fire agreement; up today takes place captivity, torture, slavery of civilians, living in conflict areas. All this acts require detailed documenting and prompt and adequate response.*
 - *Russian aggression was implemented not only in the zone of military conflict, so called Tskhinvali region, but outside too, against civilian population, even living far from this conflict zone*

Taking in consideration these extreme conditions, the Rehabilitation Centre for Victims of Torture RCT/EMPATHY, since August 8, 2008, is implementing crisis intervention program.

Crisis Intervention includes medical, mental/psychological, social and legal assistance, based on multi- profile, client oriented multidisciplinary approach.

- During 8-10 August 2008 by the RCT/EMPATHY was elaborated study and assistance

methodology based on international standards and guidelines, based on Principles of Istanbul Protocol – UN Guideline for Effective Investigation and Documentation of Torture.

- This methodology includes examination of client by using multi- profile medical file, clinical-psychological interview by using “Harvard Trauma Questionnaire (Molica et al, 1992)” and “PTSD (Watson et al, 1994) rating scale”; for long term rehabilitation programme that was started too during this period the several other questionnaires were used: MMPI test, Bass – Durkey Aggression Rate scale, Hamilton Depression Rate Scale, Back Depression Inventory, Mississippi Civilian PTSD questionnaire, Shikhan Anxiety Rate scale.
- During this period were also elaborated legal application forms in order to assess violations of Human rights and damage implemented during the barbarous military aggression and ethnic cleansing towards civilian population.
- Brief trauma recovery programme (1) includes: Exposure therapy, anxiety management and psycho – educational techniques (3), as well as social therapy and management of the urgent medical problems. (2) Long term rehabilitation programme – were started since this period.

Services

- Totally 27 professionals (psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, several specialty doctors, legal experts) from the RCT/EMPATHY and partners (GMA and TSMU Psychiatry Division) are involved in the indicated activities.
- Five mobile groups were created in the RCT/EMPATHY in the framework of above mentioned program, as well as there is going on outpatient type services for clients in office, works hotline and duty doctor’s post in 24 hour regime.
- In August 10, 2008 the special appeal was sent to the international, intergovernmental, national governmental and non-governmental agencies. This appeal, signed by RCT/EMPATHY and GMA, especially was focused on the facts of violation of international humanitarian law and other relevant international standards. Places

- During the indicated period, the crisis intervention program was implementing in following hospitals and refugee collective living centers: Iashvili children hospital, Zhvania children hospital, Burn Trauma Hospital, Gudushauri hospital, Tbilisi Hospital #4, Surgery National Centre, TSMU clinic; TSMU student dormitory, children gardens #206, #209, (Tbilisi ,Ponichala #3), children garden on 12 Kandelaki stir. in Tbilisi, former outpatient- type clinic on 8 Vazha Pshavela ave, Tbilisi, Hotel “Abkhazeti”. (Total N = 14 facilities); as well as the out patient type service was provided at the RCT/EMPATHY on regular basic, including 24 hours Duty Doctors service with Hot Line.
- Total number of persons assisted during this Crisis intervention were about 571 persons, among them 371 persons were investigated and assisted in more detail. The special report on the Consequences of War Conflict in Georgia is published on web page of RCTEMPATHY, as well as was published and distributed among state and international agencies.

The updated Special report on Consequences of Russian Brutal Military Attacks in Georgia is published separately as well and is available at the RCT/EMPATHY web page: www.empathy.ge .

2) Special Events and developments in the Country:

- a) It should be mentioned that the new Anti – Torture plan of actions were elaborated by state interagency council and ordered in June, 2008 in Georgia. Several recommendations submitted by the RCT/MPATHY to the state officials was included in this anti – torture plan, among them specially should be noted the implementation activities regarding Istanbul Protocol (UN Manual on Effective Investigation and Documentation of Torture).
- b) The special Event Roundtable was co – organized by the RCT/EMPATHY with leading role of European Commission Delegation to Georgia and Public Defender’s office on 26 of June, UN International Day in Support of Victims of Torture.
- c) The special Roundtable meeting organized by the RCT/EMPATHY and Partner organizations was held in April 30, 2008.

EU and national medical specialists and officials meet to discuss the status of current reforms in forensic and prison psychiatry in Georgia

The Roundtable meeting was held on 30 April 2008 in Tbilisi, in the conference hall of the Courtyard Marriot (4 Freedom Square, Tbilisi). The issue that discussed was Forensic and Prison Psychiatry in Georgia, Problems and Recommendations.

The conference was organized by the RCT/EMPATHY (Psycho – Rehabilitation Centre for Victims of Torture, Violence and Pronounced Stress Impact), the Georgian Medical Association, Georgian Psychiatrist’s Society, Penal Reform International, and the Crisis Intervention centre of the Women’s Association of Nabakevi and Darcheli.

Representatives of the following organizations and governmental structures were participated: Head of the European Union Delegation in Georgia, representatives of different embassies and international organizations, Public Defender of Georgia, representatives of the courts, Prosecutor’s Office, Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Healthcare, Labour and Social Issues, national Forensic Bureau etc.

Art Works made by convicted women and juveniles, probationers and former prisoners were soled.

Participants were obtaining information and participate in discussion regarding forensic and prison psychiatry reforms, problems and recommendations (special report by Dr. Mariam Jishkariani, MD. Of RCT/EMPATHY); mental health reform (Prof.Giorgi Naneishvili, MD, PhD; Chair of the Georgian Psychiatrist’s Society, Prof. Teimuraz Silagadze, MD, PhD, Medical University); the role of the national professional Medical Association in the Health Reform (Dr. Levan Labauri, MD, PhD); the rights of prisoners with mental problems, and practice in Georgia (Manana Kobakhidze, Article 42 of Constitution).

The meeting was held in the framework of the EMPATHY project “Rehabilitation of Torture Victims in Georgia” which is funded by the EU, UNVFVT, and ICRT.

- d) **The RCT/Emphathy was participate in the Conference** held at the Tbilisi State Medical University in November 2008, regarding Consequences of Russian war in Georgia and special report on the RCT/Emphathy’s Crisis Intervention activities was present on this Conference.
- e) **International Events: The RCT/Emphathy was participate in the European Network Meeting held in February 2008 in Brussels, organized by the IRCT;**
- f) **The special scientific study: Consequences of Russian Brutal Military Attacks in Georgia,** was presented at the XIV World Congress of Psychiatry in Prague, in October, 2008.

Used Methodology:

Type of assistance provided:

- a) Medical
- b) Psychological
- c) Social
- d) Legal
- e) Other, Per Diems for Victims from Regions

Holding of medical and psychological study (diagnostic) program: A) Medical and psychological diagnostic by using the special prepared clinical questionnaires in accordance with ICD – 10: 1. Center "Empathy" questionnaire "Medical and Psycho - Social Monitoring and Rehabilitation Programme for Victims of Torture", apparently with International clients monitoring program of the IRCT/ICAR /Denmark, Copenhagen/ and "Istanbul Protocol". – Clinical/structural Interview method B) Psychological examination by using the following clinical psychological questionnaires: 1. Harvard Trauma Questionnaire. 2. Posttraumatic Stress Disorder Symptoms Questionnaire (for adults - Watson, 1991). 3. Civilian Mississippi Questionnaires (Mollica et al); 4) Shikkhan Anxiety Scale; 5) Buss – Durki Aggressive Scale; 6) MMPI; 7) BDI (Beck Depression Inventory); 8) Hamilton Depression Rate Scale; For Adolescents: Lusher Test and "Hand Test", as well if appropriate PTSD and other relevant scales will be used.

I. Medical and psycho -social rehabilitation for victims of torture and ill - treatment:

- A) Psychotherapy
Methods: individual, group, family.
Types: NLP, Methods of Testimony and "eye movement", Analytical psychotherapy, Psycho - synthesis, Existential analysis, Cognitive - Behavioural, Psychodrama and role player psychotherapy etc.
- B) Psychological Support: Psycho - correction, Re - socialization, by using Reality Therapy and Behavioural Therapy methods. Psychological consultations for prisons staff and victims family members as well.
- C) Art - Therapy - by using of painting and clay modelling methods.
- D) Social Therapy: By using the methods of environmental support and case management. Revealing the current problems and needs of the torture victims (prisoners and former prisoners and their family members or other torture victims and their family members). Providing the support for planning and solving their problems, client advocacy and, in cases of necessity, to collaborate with Governmental and Non - Governmental organizations having more specific directions (legal aid or other) for solving the revealed problems. Creating the Self - Supporting groups among torture victims and an active participation of such groups in social rehabilitation process (participating in the movement against torture, client advocacy or other prevention activities etc). Facilitation activities between prison administration or medical authorities and

prisoners for conflict resolution and improvement of general situation in the prisons. Activation of the prison staff, especially health professionals and prisoners' rights protection staff in client advocacy activities.

- E) Medical consultation - General Doctor's, Psychiatrists, Neurologist, Traumatologists and other needed consultations consultations and treatment and rehabilitation, in cases of necessity providing facilitation activities with Ministry of Justice Health system or Ministry of Health several institutions for sending the patients for more specialized relevant treatment.
- F) To provide independent Psycho - Physical expertise – conclusion (record) regarding client's health condition - for Governmental structures (for ex. for Court etc) or non - governmental organizations working in the Human Rights protection sphere, especially for Ombudsman Office. The Independent Medical Records are provided by the multidisciplinary Team of Health Care Specialists in accordance with international standards of torture investigation and documentation (Istanbul Protocol, CPT Recommendations etc).
- G) For more specialized service that were not included in the Centre service list the clients were guided in several contracting Medical Service Centres. For comprehensive health care for VT Centre EMPATHY have close collaboration with following Health Care institutions and other contracting authorities :

As well as for more specialized treatment Centre EMPATHY collaborated with Ministry of Health or independent health institutions;

- H) Legal Consultation and assistance – through providing the legal consultations to VT and their family members outside and inside of the prison institutions, support in appealing to the Court and leading cases that are under investigation;

Re-Evolution of the Client's Health Condition, Post-Treatment:

- Clinical and as needed para - clinical methods.
- Re-evaluation using psychological questionnaires
- PTSD tests
- MMPI
- Depression and anxiety evaluation questionnaires
- Using the Empathy's Client's Subjective Evaluation Questionnaire

For each activity of the RCT/EMPATHY the particularly important are following approaches:

- Voluntarily investigation, treatment and rehabilitation;
- In accordance with client's wishes treatment should be anonymous with keeping in confidence.

- The international medical ethics principles: Client's informed consent and confidentiality, medical confidentiality should be guaranteed and respected; Professional independence etc.
- The multidisciplinary approach is a basis for rehabilitation activities, held by the MDT group of specialists with the leading role of the Case Manager;
- Individual client oriented approach, based on client's needs assessment are used in each case and the individual case management and rehabilitation plan of actions is elaborated and implemented for solving of addressed problems.

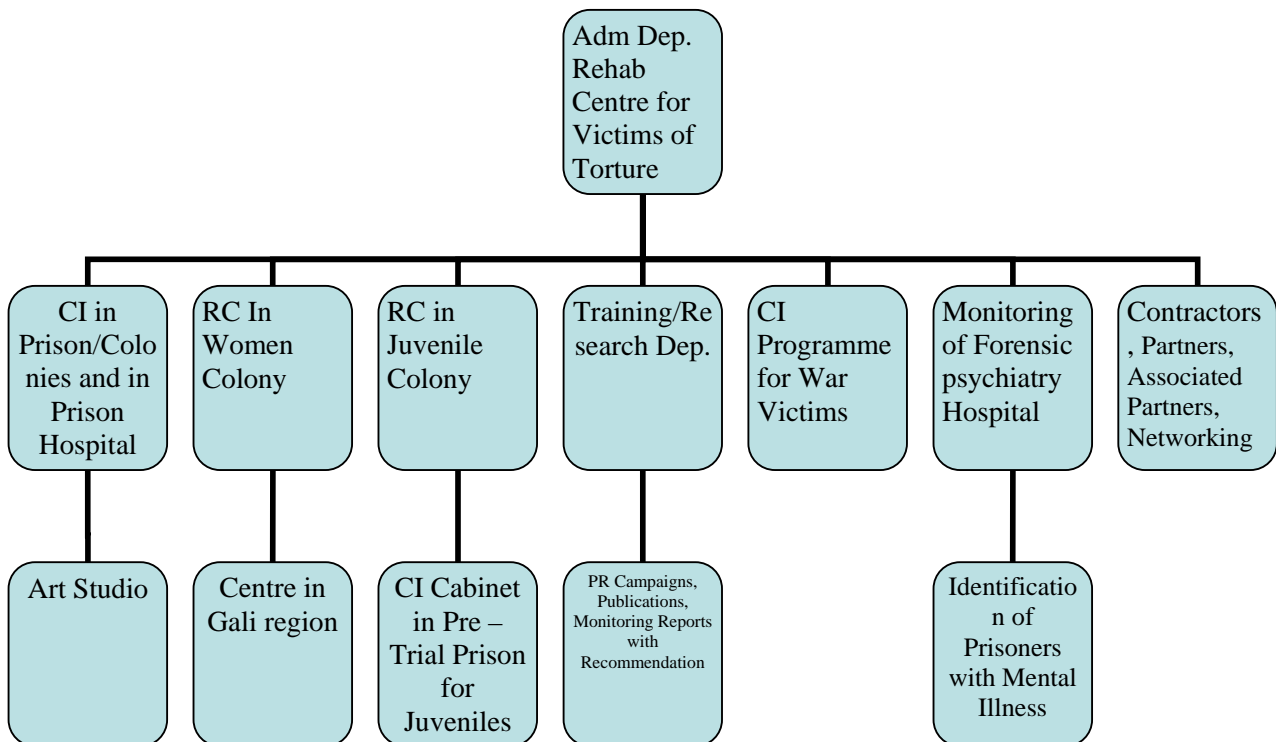

In-House Training

Training for professionals involved in the implementation of the project.

a) Several training sessions were provided during the year 2008 by the RCT/EMPATHY:

- 1) Training held During the War Conflict in Georgia in August 2008: 3 training sessions (2 days each) was held in the RCT/EMPATHY office for health professionals and lawyers working in the field of crisis intervention for new war victims. Total number of trained health professionals was about 40 persons, among them about 20 persons RCT/EMPATHY staff and consultants, and 20 persons - psychiatrists, psychologists from other state and non – state agencies, among them students and psychiatry residents from the Tbilisi State Medical University. The main topic of training was the assistance that should be provided during the crisis intervention, as well as documentation of cases according to the principles of Istanbul Protocol Guidelines.
- 2) Training for Prison Doctors; In November 28 – 30, The training on Prevention, Documentation and rehabilitation of Torture, as well as on international and national standards on Prison Health was conducted for prison doctors at the RCT/EMPATHY office. The following materials were distributed on this training: the Power Point Presentations on the indicated topics; Istanbul Protocol CD version, Health Care in Prison (RCT/EMPATHY publication); Torture, Outcomes and Rehabilitation (RCT/ EMPATHY, publication); International Standards for the Fight against Torture (IRCT Publication, Translated and published on Georgian by the RCT/EMPATHY). During this training 10 prison doctors were trained.
- 3) In December 1 – 3, 2008 the special training for the RCT/EMPATHY staff and consultants was held at the RCT/EMPATHY office. The issue of training was Strengthening of Reporting according to the Istanbul Protocol in Georgia. In the training session totally about 20 persons health professionals (several specialties doctors, psychologists, social workers, nurse etc), as well as 3 lawyers were participated. The trainers were one psychiatrist from the RCT/EMPATHY, one Medical Expert from Georgian Medical Association, One forensic medical expert from the Tbilisi State Medical University and one Legal Expert from the University. 5 medical reports prepared according to the Istanbul Protocol were reviewed and 5 legal applications to Strasburg European Court of Human Rights were reviewed as well during this training.

b) All this knowledge is in use on practice, the RCT/EMPATHY professionals are only doctors in Georgia that provided clients with medical expertise reports according to Istanbul Protocol, as well as the Crisis Intervention programme implemented during war conflict in Georgia was using in practice methodology elaborated and distributed during the special training sessions held in August 2008 at the RCT/EMPATHY.

Additional 41 persons were investigated and consulted in the regions of Georgia: The IDPs from Kodori Gorge became refugees in their Country of residence in 11- 12 August, 2008, after the bombing their living areas by the Russian Air – jets and after military aggression and intervention in Kodori Gorge (this area is very different then the current military conflict was appraised – Tskhinvali region).

The interviewed 11 persons in Gali region described several kind of physical and psychological violence and ill – treatment toward Georgian citizens living in the Military Conflict zone in Abkhazia, among them robbery, beating, humiliation, slave labour experience, threatening etc.

In all cases aim of inhuman and ill – treatment were ethnical and political discrimination.

According to the Table and crisis intervention data, observation reveals high level of physical and psychological violence and ill – treatment toward civilian population of Georgia, about 8 facts of different kind of violence toward 1 person. This data indicates experience of “life Stress Traumatic Events” in all

investigated survivors of War. They can be considered as the high level risk groups for developing the stress related disorders.

According to the study programme 186 of 330 (56.36 %) have physical outcomes of psychological and physical violence and ill treatment, among them in 64 % of cases revealed direct injuries of ill – treatment and mass violence, in 33 % cases exacerbation of chronic diseases and in 34 % of cases – psycho – somatic reactions. According to this data F = 1, 31 that means that one person had more then 1 disorder.

Consequently all these survivors are in need of medical, psychological, social and legal rehabilitation too.

In about 30 % of cases were revealed PTSD symptoms and other neurotic level symptoms, in 11 % of cases organic genesis disorders, in 2 % of cases psychotic symptoms, 9 % of cases mental retardation. According to the data of table, we can conclude that in all 371 cases the torture, mass violence and ill – treatment were take place on the territory of Georgia, were conducted toward to the civilian population living in the villages or towns not only in Tskhinvali surrounding areas (Military conflict area in the beginning of August 7 – 8), were conducted with direct participation of Russian military forces or with their silent consent or support. The aim of described inhuman acts was ethnical and political discrimination and terrorization of civilian population of Georgia, together with ethnic cleansing in the territory of so called South Osetia and Abkhazia (Kodori Gorge). Described in the Special report of the RCT/EMPATHY (www.empathy.ge) cases are illustrated all these decisions.

As it seems from the table the torture and ill treatment facts were take place in the military conflict zones in Georgia, as well as in Police loc ups and penal system, perpetrators in most of cases are State representatives, or in Military Conflict zone illegally created military forces together with Russian military forces or so called "Peacemakers). It should be mentioned that ill treatment facts was reveled toward to juveniles in orphans' Houses and in police and prison system as well. The problems take place toward to the prison health care system in Georgia; especially in cases of mentally ill patients how still are in prison institutions without any adequate treatment and care.
