Brief History of the Organization

The RCT/EMPATHY is health and legal experts professional organization; founded in Tbilisi, Georgia in 1996. Since 2002 accredited at the IRCT

General Context

The whole population living in Georgia is amount 4, 5 million.

Georgia is low income Country with developing economy and reforms of democratization.

However the War Conflicts and political tension situation between Russian Federation and Georgia since 1992 – 1993 creates horrible problems for independency and democratization of Georgia.

- Georgia is the post soviet Country that restored independence in 1991.
- Georgia acceded to the UN Convention Against Torture ...on 22 September 1994 but, unfortunately, the relevant changes have not fully been made in the national legislation, bearing heavily on the efforts to fight torture.
- In 1999 Georgia became the member state of the Council of Europe and accepted all relevant documents and Conventions, among them European Convention on Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms – Article 3: Prohibition of Torture (Rome, 4 November 1950); European Convention on Prevention of Torture and Inhumane, Degrading Treatment or Punishment (Turine, 18.10.1961);
- In year 2005 Georgia ratified the Optional Protocol to the UN Convention Against Torture that enter into force in June 22, 2006.
- In year 2014 the Association Agreement with European Union was signed.


General Description of the Situation In 1993 – 1998, 2008 after the Russian military aggression more then 500000 civilians, 1/9 of population of Georgia became IDPs or refugees, victims of ethnic cleansing and about 20 % of territories of Georgia still are occupied by the Russian forces

General Description of the Situation

- Consequence of Russian Georgian War more then 150 000 civilians from South Ossetia became victims of ethnic cleansing and for nowadays are living in the temporary living villages out of occupied territory
- On the other hand civilians living in the nearest villages of occupied territory still are under threat of kidnapping, creeping aggression followed by changing the so called borders, accordingly their gardens and farms became occupied too
- Population living in the military conflict zone in Abkhazia, about 60 000 still are under discrimination, ill - treatment, in unsecured environment without any rule of law and protection


Overall Objectives are




Target Group

- The Target groups are the torture victims according to the UN CAT Article 1 and 16, European Convention of Fundamental Human Rights and Freedoms: Article 3 and 13, and victims of the violation of international humanitarian law, including family members and second generation.
- Special attention has been paid to women and children who have experienced sexual abuse, captivity, torture, domestic violence, slave labour experience and trafficking within the military conflict regions.
- Specific attention has been paid to detainees, prisoners and former prisoners who have experienced torture, and prisoners with mental problems, especially women and juveniles.
- The health and legal professionals from the NGO and State sectors, human rights activists and journalists were included in the target group for the training education programme.

Average clients per year are 500 persons.



Main Results of years 2013 - 2016

During the implementation period 2013 - 2016 the Caucasian Anti -Torture Network was established in Georgia. The multi-disciplinary services for victims of torture were strengthened in Georgia, including Abkhazia, as well as in Armenia and Chechnya, activities on prevention and accountability were increased in whole indicated region, including Azerbaijan; Strong communication and advocacy strategy were developed between networking partners. The action linked to the other torture related projects in Central Asian Region with developing the networking with international partners involved in the implementation of this action. At the micro level: more than 2000 persons - victims of torture and ill - treatment and their family members received adequate multi services, focused on medical, mental/psychological, social and legal assistance. T n 225 health professionals, legal experts and journalists from 6 countries of Caucasus, Central Asia and Russian Federation (Chechnya) were trained on effective documentation of cases of torture and on holistic approach in rehabilitation of the victims, 30 persons from them became trainer/experts as well,


Charity Actions

ICC Started Investigation

In October 13, 2015 the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, Fatou Bensouda, requested judges to authorise and open an investigation into the Situation in Georgia related to the Russian - Georgian War 2008 that clearly demonstrates the importance of the problem that is addressed by our study. In the end of 2015 the permission was given from Judges Office for Investigation of war crimes.
